EXPECTED SKILLS TO BE ACHIEVE

Note: No examination will be conducted. There will be continuous assessment through out the session

Language development comprises of four main activities: listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE

- 1. Recognition of alphabet (object sound, symbol Association)
- 2. Should be able to use crayons and slate, pencil on paper and slate.
- 3. Expected to write the capital letters (A to Z) by the end of the session.
- 4. Match alphabet cards with wooden and plastic alphabet.
- 5. Expected to match the alphabet cards with pictures
- 6. Should be able to understand and co-relate the sequence of stories by seeing the pictures, video cassettes, Cds.

MATH

- 1. Should be able to draw various patterns on sand tray, slate and paper.
- 2. Match the three basic shapes: triangle, circle and square with objects.
- 3. Should be able to recognise and write numbers (1 to 20).

EVS

- 1. Should be able to recognise and tell the names of the **fruits**, **flowers**, **birds and animals** from the flash cards and picture books.
- 2. Match basic colours: **red, blue, yellow** using Montessori Apparatus
- 3. Should have done colouring of three basic shapes

Special Note:

- Develop the ability to express themselves in English in short and simple sentences and words
- Should be able to follow the commands of the teacher given in English.
- Should be able to recite a number of nursery rhymes with action.
- Be able to say a few sentences in English
 example "I want to drink water", I am hungry, I want to have my tiffin, I want to go
 to washroom, I have done my work, I can draw a cat.

EXERCISES OF PRACTICAL LIFE

- 1. How to enter the classroom (wipe feet on the doormat).
- 2. How to sit down on a chair without making noise.
- 3. Walk quietly up to the teacher's table.
- 4. Carry a chair, table and place it without making noise.
- 5. How to hold a book, turn the pages of a book.
- 6. To take things from the shelf and place them back properly after use.
- 7. Arrange the classroom, dust the furniture.

CARE OF ONE'S PERSON

- 1. To see one's face in the mirror.
- 2. To see the whole body. (See that buttons, zips and the shoe laces etc. are done up properly)
- Wash hands and face and wipe with a clean towel.

EXERCISES ON CARRYING

- 1. How to carry a tray and hold a jug, book and walk gracefully.
- 2. How to arrange the school bag and carry it properly.

CARE OF ENVIRONMENT

- Dusting, sweeping, mopping, polishing, arranging flowers, laying the table for lunch, folding napkins etc.
- How to open / close the door, drawer.

SOCIAL LIFE IN THE CLASS

- 1. To speak softly, To say 'thank you', To greet people.
- 2. How to ask for a thing from somebody- to say 'please', 'may I' etc.
- 3. How to offer a pointed object, e.g a pencil, scissors, knife, etc.
- 4. How to walk in a line in between the desks without touching others.
- 5. How to ascend and descend the staircase by keeping to the left.
- 6. To walk on tip-toes.
- 7. To wipe a running nose with a handkerchief and put back the handkerchief properly.
- 8. How to cough, sneeze and yawn, cover the mouth, say 'sorry' and 'excuse me'.
- 9. How to ask permission to pass by a person (Excuse me please).
- 10. How to apologise (I am sorry), when and why.
- 11. How to use the toilet.

OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES BASED ON MUSCLE CO-ORDINATION - Can be set in the open.


- 1. Various kinds of drills and marching, jumping, climbing, swimming, hopping, skipping, etc.

Hygiene And Tiffin Time

1. Hand Hygiene:- (Washing Hands)

- 1. Teach children to wash hands with soap and water.
- 2. Before eating or touching food.
- 3. After playing outside or with toys.
- 4. After sneezing, coughing, or blowing their nose.

2. Toilet Hygiene:

- 1. Encourage flushing the toilet after use.
- 2. Teach them to wash their hands afterward.

3. Coughing and Sneezing

- 1. Cover their mouth and nose with a tissue or their elbow when coughing or sneezing.
- 2. Dispose of tissues in a bin and wash hands immediately.

4. Oral Hygiene

- 1. Encourage brushing teeth twice a day with a small amount of toothpaste.
- 2. Teach them to rinse and spit properly.

5. Cleanliness

- 1. Teach them to keep their nails trimmed and clean.
- 2. Encourage wiping their face and hands with a clean cloth or tissue.

6. Clothing and Personal Items

- 1. Teach them to wear clean clothes daily.
- 2. Label their personal items to prevent sharing (e.g., water bottles, hats).

7. Tidy Environment

- 1. Show them how to clean up after playtime.
- 2. Teach them to dispose of trash in a bin.
